And although Puerto Rico has its own national language (Spanish), anthem, and competes independently of the United States at the 1958 Olympics, the American flag still flies over San Juan, the capital of this Caribbean state. There are actually three islands in the USVI - St. Thomas, St. John, and St. Croix - and each has its own temperament. Note that two main airports, in St. Thomas and St. Croix, serve the U.S. Virgin Islands. John, the most natural of the USVI, is accessible by ferry from St. Thomas and less frequently from St. Croix. The subtropical climate in the Keys makes it a favorite destination all year round, although hurricanes often threaten between November 1 and 30 (Atlantic Hurricane season). Continue to 6 of 9 below. 06 of 09 Getty Images The Barrier Islands off the coast of North Carolina, known as the Outer Coast (often abbreviated as OBC) are some of the most fragile islands on the U.S. Atlantic coast, which is why many natural enthusiasts take care of the beaches here. Sea turtles, migratory birds and even some wild horses live on these partition islands. The outer banks consist of the national seashore of Cape Hatteras, a 70 km nature reserve that covers the area between Bodie Island and Okrakok Island. Between us is Hatteras Island, one of the longest islands in the country with a length of 50 miles. Some of the most popular beach destinations in Outer Banks are the towns of Kitty Hawk, Kill Devil Hills, and The Head of The Ngs (part of the northern beaches) and the villages of Hatteras Island. Its proximity to New York means that Long Island is heavily populated, but also well connected to public transportation (long island rail) and highways. The beaches of Long Island are very popular in summer, especially on Jones Beach, on the island's south coast, and the Hamptons (video), a Tony area at the eastern end of the island that many celebrities call home. The Hamptons are a very modern summer getaway for New York's walking and shaker, leading to crowded nightclubs and expensive accommodation. More on Long Island... Since then, several presidents, including Bill Clinton and Barack Obama, have chosen this small island seven miles from Cape Cod as their summer vacation destination. Martha's Vineyard has 19 beaches, golf, tons of art galleries and a separate atmosphere in New England, thanks to sights such as lighthouses and gingerbread villas.
